



Unité 1 – Task:

Un plan de supermarché (Plan of a supermarket)

Create, digitally or as a drawing/poster, a plan of a French supermarket (*un plan de supermarché*) and imagine a conversation in the supermarket.

- Include the following **signs**/items in the plan. Include any other signs that you might typically see in a supermarket.

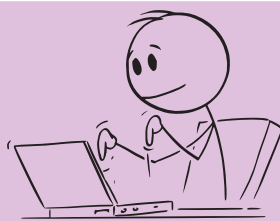
French	English
Entrée/Sortie	Entrance/Exit
Chariots/Caddies/Paniers	Shopping carts/Baskets
Les caisses/Caisses automatiques	Checkouts/Self-service
Accueil/Service client	Customer Service
Consigne bouteilles	Bottle return

- Label the **aisles** in the supermarket.
 - Rayon fruits et légumes: *Fruit and vegetables*
 - Boulangerie/Pâtisserie: *Fresh bread and pastries*
 - Boucherie/Charcuterie: *Meat counter and deli*
 - Poissonnerie: *Fishmonger/seafood*
 - Fromagerie: *Cheese counter*
 - Épicerie salée: *"Salty" pantry items (pasta, rice, canned goods, oils, snacks)*
 - Épicerie sucrée: *"Sweet" pantry items (biscuits, coffee, tea, chocolate, jams).*
 - Produits surgelés: *Frozen foods*
 - Boissons/Cave à vin: *Alcoholic drinks and wine*
- Create a **dialogue** where you ask a shop assistant where you might find a particular section/aisle (*rayon*). You may include some of the following phrases.

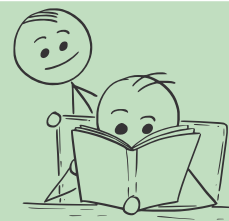
French	English
Excusez-moi	Excuse me
Où se trouve le rayon ... ?	Where is the ... section ?
Je cherche	I am looking for
Le rayon ... est à gauche/à droite.	The ... aisle is on the left/right.
Merci, madame/monsieur.	Thank you madam/sir.



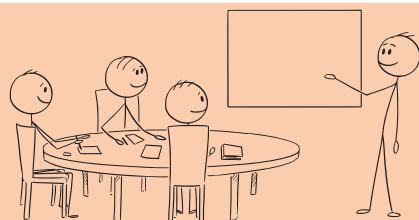
To prepare the task, you might like to pair up with a classmate or form a group.
