Task: Carry out a research project on either Pierre or Marie Curie's life.

## **General Information**

Your project can be submitted as an A4 poster, a PowerPoint presentation, a video no longer than five minutes or a podcast no longer than ten minutes. If you wish to complete the research project in any other form, check with your teacher before starting to ensure it is suitable.

## Success Criteria

To achieve success in this task, you should do the following:

- Include information on either Pierre or Marie Curie's early life. For example, when and where they were born, how many brothers or sisters they had, what their parents did for a living, etc.
- Include information on your chosen scientist's education. For example, what school and university they attended, the years they attended, what type of degree they achieved, how they paid for university, etc.
- Include information on their working life. For example, where they worked, who they worked with, what their research focused on, the discoveries they made, etc.
- Include information on their personal life. For example, where they met, when they got married, how many children they had, where they lived, etc.
- Include information on their Nobel Prize(s). For example, what Nobel Prize(s) they won, why they won the Nobel Prize(s), what they did with the money they received from the Nobel Prize(s), etc.
- Include information on their death and legacy. For example, how they died, when and where they died, where they are buried, the impact their work had on life today, the tributes they received, etc.
- Use reliable and valid sources. These must be included in a bibliography at the end of your project.
- Think creatively and present your project in a unique way.
- Present the information in your own words.
